

The challenge

Usually, after a project ends most products are not updated and remain static





The challenge

- Three specific goals:
- Indispensable database: to build a remote sensing based dataset combining with inputs from existing data holders, and broad land owners and land management agents.
- Interactive operation platform: to shape a biodiversity information platform which conservationists can work with, and policy makers, researchers, and businesses can benefit from.
- Sustainable funding mechanism: to produce value added products for both purposes of self-funding and impact biodiversity drivers.

Potential User Groups

- **Governments** (inter-governmental organizations, national and local governments, and government agencies) have legal obligation of reporting.
- **Conservationists** (conservation researchers, conservation NGOs, community scientists, and the public) are willing to engage in EU BON for their interests.
- Businesses and consumers can benefit economically from EU BON by employing environmentally responsible behaviors.





Product concepts for EU BON

Public data service


- **Metadata**: available openly and freely for all.
- Value added products for target users
 - Biodiversity report: developed for governments and businesses with legal obligation of reporting.
 - Online consulting: targeting at businesses and consumers for both benefits of conservation and profits.
 - Membership: designed for conservationists (conservation researchers, community scientists, and other individuals with conservation interests) to satisfy their interests.




- The business plan will identify

EU BÔN




- Core EU BON

Funding phases

80

- Nurturing stage (2017-2020): mainly provide public data services and funded by government grants.
- **Growing stage** (2021-2025): value added products have been developed and profits from these services have become as significant as government grants.
- Maturing stage (after 2025): value added products have been fully developed and marketed so that provide the majority funding for sustaining EU BON












Collaborative Funding
